





All learners from babies to grand mothers, learn better with stories, stories are energizers. When someone says, "Let me tell you a story," listeners perk up their ears and smile. Even hard truths can be taught easily through stories.

Stories told and read at home and school entertain and educate youth. Using stories in the classroom is fun, but the activity should not be considered trivial or frivolous. Indeed, there is strong support for story telling in pedagogical theory. Cortazzi (1994) points out that story telling is fundamental to education and specifically to language teaching. Zips (1995) and Morgan and Rinvolucri (1992) find stories a basic part of the whole language approach to learning, reaching the whole person and appealing to the subconscious. According to Brumfit and Johnson (1979), reading or telling stories in class is a natural way to learn a new language.
