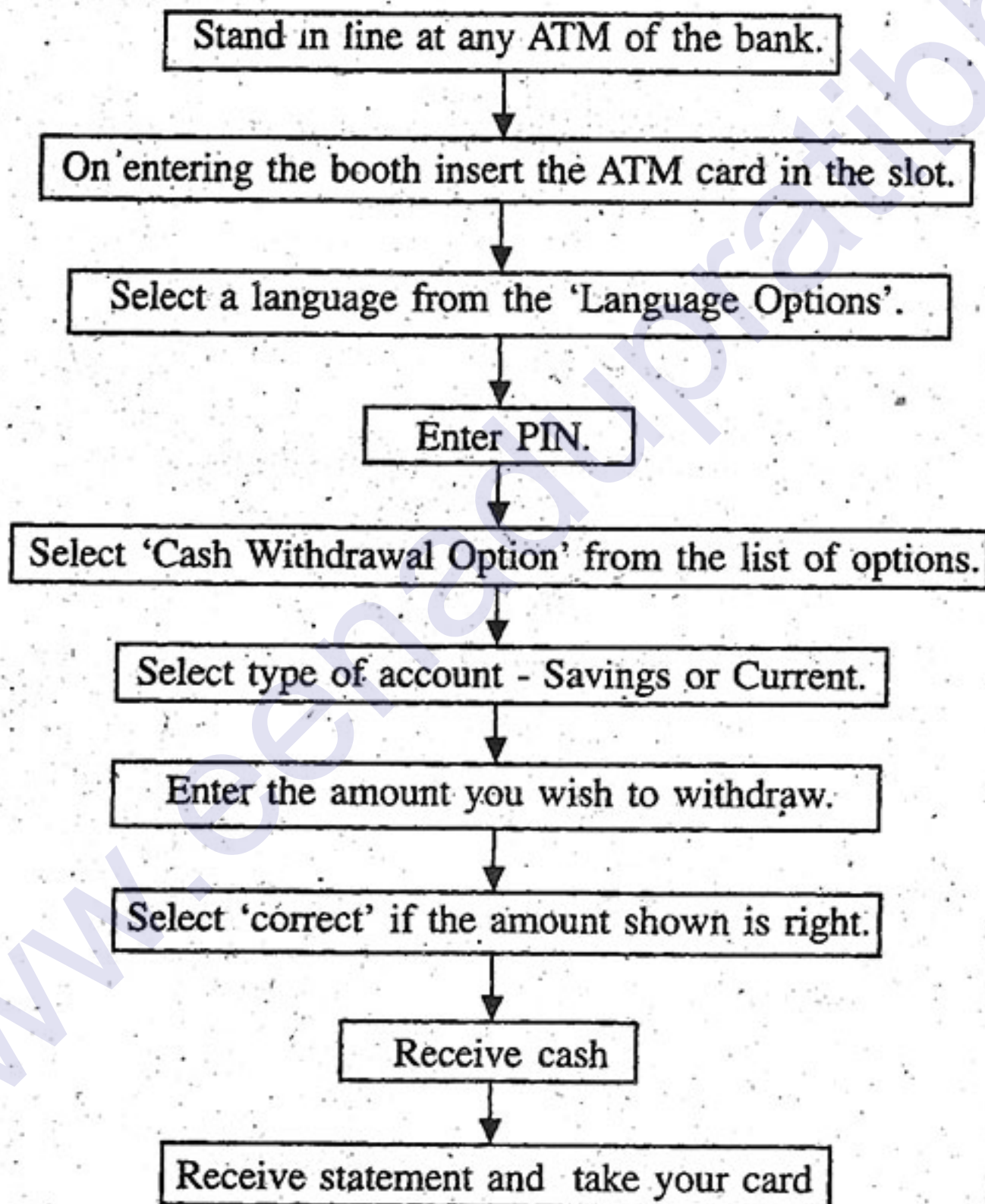

The camera itself has become only one small part of a photographer's equipment. There are lenses, cases, tripods, flashes, remote light meters and many other items that work together. With this amazing array of equipment available, how does a photographer know what they should carry with them? However, there are some basic items you can take to cover most situations. For any situation the camera itself and a lens (whether built in or interchangeable) are always needed. Most photographers carry at least two lenses. A wide-angle lens is one that shows you a large field of vision while a telephoto lens is like a pair of binoculars for your camera. A UV filter can protect your expensive lens without causing noticeable change to your image. A flash ensures that the camera is ready for low-light situations. Most cameras have a built in, or "on board" flash. The camera bag is a safety device for the camera and other equipment. It holds the camera, lenses, flash, memory cards and other accessories safely within a padded environment.
